The success that we enjoy in the District, now in its 177th year of excellence, is no accident. It happens because of the determination and will of its leadership, its citizens and its community. For years now we as students, parents and educators have been fortunate to partner with the Berkley Education Foundation to provide the additional tools and resources needed to elevate the educational experience from good to great.
